Whether it is done in a textbook, a scholarly monograph, a work of art, or everyday conversation, historical representation is a deliberate and creative act, resting on assumptions of what the past was like and how history "happens." Buried within every attempt to depict the past is a philosophy of history; and all of these attempts together make up the intellectual history of historical representation, which specialists call historiography. In this course, we will explore video games as a medium of historical representation and stake out the place of video games within the historiographical tradition. We will play, watch, and discuss a wide array of history-based games—which includes popular franchises such as Civilization, Assassin's Creed, and Red Dead Redemption, as well as lesser known and vintage titles—critically examining the philosophies of history at work behind the pixels, and discovering how "playing the past" uniquely shapes our understanding of it.
